KEEPING THE ROLL

ACTIVE, INACTIVE AND INELIGIBLE

Registering to Vote

We receive your voter registration application.

The FL Division of Elections uses your Driver License or SSN to verify who you are.

You are now an "active" registered voter in Hillsborough County (***Congratulations!***)

Staying in Touch



- We mail you a Voter Information Card confirming your voter information.
- If you request a Vote By Mail ballot, we'll send your ballot in the mail.
- Otherwise, we'll send you a Sample Ballot before each election you're eligible for.

We hope that if you move, you'll let us know.



If you forget, we might find out about your move from the post office. When that happens, we'll send an address change notice to your new address confirming that we've updated your voter registration information with your new address.

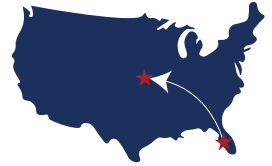


Inactive

If that doesn't happen, the mail we send you will come back to our office as "undeliverable" and we'll send a forwardable postcard asking you to confirm your address. *If you don't respond within 30 days, your voter status changes from "active" to "inactive," but you are still eligible to vote.*

Maintaining a Clean List

So, we move voters to **inactive** status **only** when they appear to no longer be living where they registered to vote.



After two General Elections, if an inactive voter hasn't voted or had any contact with our office

only then are they removed from the voter roll.



The State also sends us names of deceased voters and voters who become **ineligible** to vote due to a felony conviction or judgement of mental incapacity for voting. In accordance with FL law, we review the evidence first, and then provide the voter with an opportunity to refute it **before** they are removed.

What's in a Name?

Active and **Inactive** status have nothing to do with how often you vote.



Active

Registered and eligible to vote



Inactive

Still registered and eligible to vote



Ineligible

Cannot vote in our county; if voter become eligible, must re-register
