Get Ready to Vote don't wait to update

September 27 is National Voter Registration Day. Around the country, there will be a huge national effort focused on making sure those who are eligible to vote are registered to vote.




Throughout the month, we'll be at high schools, colleges, malls and events to do our part.

If you aren't registered to vote, now is the time to do it. Find the forms at our offices, our website, at libraries and county offices.

If you're already registered, please check our website or call us to make sure your voter information is current. If your name, address or signature has changed, now is the time to let us know.

And if you haven't requested a Vote By Mail ballot yet, now is the time to request one. It only takes a few minutes to make the request. Visit VoteHillsborough.org or call (813) 744-5900.

With Vote By Mail, you'll get your ballot in the mail, take time to research candidates and issues, make your voting decisions in the comfort of your own home, and then drop the ballot in the mail (we pay the postage) or at one of our offices or Early Vote sites (when they're open). There's no easier or more convenient way to vote!

You vote when you have time and then drop it in the mail, or at one of our offices or Early Vote sites. How easy is that?

You can vote at any of 16 sites, check the wait times online, and pick the time and place that fits your schedule.

You vote in your neighborhood, but you can only vote in your assigned polling place. Make sure you know where to go.

The turnout for our Primary Election was higher in terms of overall voters and percentage than the 2012 Primary Election. But turnout for the General Election is likely to be **four times higher** than the Primary.

DON'T WAIT UNTIL THE LAST DAY TO VOTE!

We could see record-breaking turnout on Election Day, so please plan to vote **before** Election Day if you can.

We are taking Vote By Mail requests now, and we'll be stuffing envelopes soon! Our first mail ballots will go out September 23 to overseas and absent military voters, and we'll begin mailing ballots to domestic voters on October 4.

We'll also have 16 Early Voting sites open 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. from Oct. 24 - Nov. 6, including weekends.

Tell all your friends NOT to leave something important to the last minute. Election Day is the **LAST** day to vote!
