As I love to remind voters, Election Day isn't the first day to vote, it's the last day to vote! You can choose one of three ways to vote in Hillsborough County: Vote By Mail, Early Voting or Election Day.



Vote in the privacy and comfort of your home — the most convenient way to vote! Call us or visit VoteHillsborough.org to request your ballot. When you finish voting, seal and sign the envelope. Then just drop it in the mail (we have already paid your return postage) or drop it off in a secure ballot box at any of our offices or Early Voting sites (when they're open). Ballots must be in our office no later than **7 p.m. on March 17**.

The post office recommends allowing at least a week for the ballot to reach us by mail. Vote By Mail ballots cannot be dropped off at an Election Day polling place, but you can choose to vote in person instead, and your mail ballot will be cancelled.

Early Voting

March 2 - 15, 10 a.m. - 6 p.m.

You can vote at any of 23 sites, so pick the time and location that works best for your schedule. You can even vote on the weekend. We know life gets busy, and we want to make sure you have time to vote.

On Election Day, you must vote in the polling place assigned to your precinct.

What to bring when voting in person:

Bring a current and valid photo and signature ID to the polls. If you don't bring ID, you may vote a provisional ballot. Florida accepts these forms of photo identification:



- Florida Driver License
- Florida ID Card (issued by the Dept. of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles)
- U.S. Passport
- Debit or Credit Card
- Military ID
- Student ID

- Retirement Center ID
- Neighborhood Association ID
- Public Assistance ID
- Veteran Health ID (issued by VA)
- Concealed Weapon License (issued pursuant to s. 790.06)
- Government Employee ID
